Dear Idaho Chiefs:

The Idaho Chiefs of Police Association (ICOPA) is proud to present Fall Conference 2017 in Twin Falls on October 2, 3, and 4, 2017, at the Canyon Crest Event Center located at 330 Canyon Crest Drive. We have a lot of exciting things scheduled for this conference.

We will start off on Sunday morning with an opportunity to golf at the beautiful Blue Lakes Country Club. Golf will start at 10:00 a.m. The rate for golf is \$60.00, which includes greens fees and cart. Please let us know no later than September 18, 2017, if you'd like to join us so that we can make the necessary arrangements. There is food available at the club if you'd like to have lunch there. Golf fees and meals are on your own, payable to the Blue Lakes Country Club.

On Sunday evening, October 1st, at 6:00 p.m., we will have an ICOPA Board Meeting at the Blue Lakes Country Club.

During this conference, we have four exceptional presentations. On Monday morning, Chief Jerald Monahan will provide the first presentation based on his involvement in addressing issues surrounding violence against women. He has been a member of the Board of Directors for Against Abuse, Inc.; Pinal County Domestic Violence Coalition; was instrumental in getting the Pinal County Domestic Violence Fatality Review Team started in 1996; was appointed to the Governor's Commission to Prevent Violence Against Women in 2003 and reappointed in 2008; served on the Board of Directors for two domestic violence shelters; is a consultant for the National Domestic Violence Fatality Review Initiative; serves as the Vice President of the Board of Directors for End Violence Against Women International and frequently presents on the "Start by Believing" Campaign.

Monday afternoon, Chief Jarrod Burguan with the San Bernardino Police Department, will provide an overview of the San Bernardino mass shooting incident that took place on December 2, 2015, including suspect profiles, investigation, and attack timeline. The incident was determined to be the largest terrorist inspired act on United States soil since the attack of September 11, 2001; 14 people were killed and 22 wounded. The world watched as local law enforcement engaged the attackers in a gun battle that wounded two officers and killed two suspects. Chief Burguan will share the lessons learned during the active shooter incident that occurred in 2015.

In the summer of 2016, after just six months as the Chief of Police for the City of Twin Falls, Chief Craig Kingsbury found himself, his agency, and the City as a whole in the middle of the national, political debate regarding immigration reform and refugees. Chief Kingsbury and City Public Information Officer Josh Palmer will discuss what they learned from this event and how the City of Twin Falls banded together to deal with all the attacks and media spotlight.

On Tuesday afternoon, Grant Fredericks will present “Unmasking the Truth Behind Video Driven Investigations of Police.” This dynamic seminar demonstrates that video evidence is often misinterpreted, especially body-worn video in use of force investigations. With body-worn cameras, in-car video, and social media technologies, most police force events are recorded, but are the images accurate? Grant Fredericks is a Certified Forensic Video Analyst and a contract instructor at the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. He has testified over 200 times in courts throughout the US, Canada, the UK, New Zealand and other parts of the world. Grant was the Technical Manager for a large scale criminal investigation involving 5,000 hours of video evidence, directing the work of 50 forensic video analysts. His work won the IACP’s top award for Technical Advances in a Criminal Investigation. Grant has consulted for the US Department of Justice, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, and the National Institute of Justice and co-authored the standards document *Digital Video Systems Minimum Performance Specifications*.

We will be offering local law enforcement agencies the opportunity to send officers/employees to these presentations. We are working with POST to approve this training so that attendees earn training credits. There will be a cost of \$50 per day to attend training.

We have reserved a block of rooms at LaQuinta Inn and Suites located at 539 Pole Line Road, Twin Falls, Idaho. To make reservations, please call 1-866-527-1498 and indicate property number 6548. 
